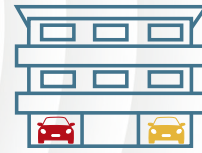


Introducing Earthquake Multi-Unit Retrofit (EMR) Grant Program!

Funds to Strengthen Residential Structures™

The **Earthquake Multi-Unit Retrofit (EMR)** program helps property owners of multi-unit residential buildings with 5-10 units lessen the potential for seismic damage during an earthquake.

Buildings that qualify for an EMR grant:

- are located in cities that have a mandatory, multi-unit residential soft-story retrofit ordinance;
- are multi-story, wood-framed, and built before 1991;
- are multi-unit residential buildings with 5–10 units; and
- have tuck-under parking on the ground floor.

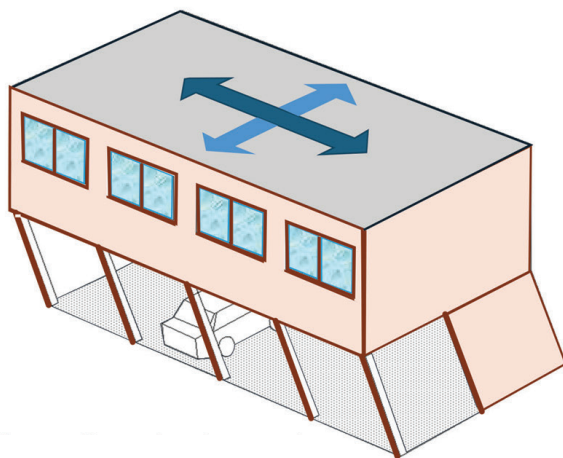

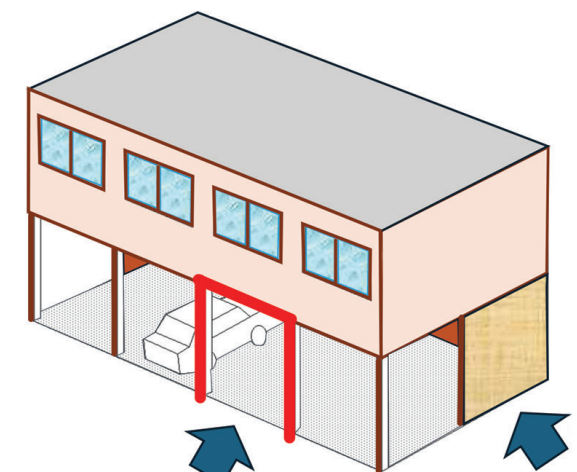

Before Retrofit



Existing walls and columns do not have the stiffness or strength to support the heavy upper floors and may collapse.

After Retrofit



New steel frame

New anchor bolts and plywood sheathing on ground floor walls.



Residential structure with tuck-under parking

A multi-unit soft-story building

- typically has a large open space (garage area), with walls not braced to resist earthquake motion, or
- openings in the perimeter walls for tuck-under parking.

What does an EMR grant cover?

- up to \$4,260 per unit, not to exceed 70% of the cost of completing the retrofit; plus
- up to \$7,000, not to exceed 70% of the cost, for securing building permits and developing engineered plans.

Seismic retrofitting benefits:

- reduces the risk of injury that may result from the effects of earthquakes on wood frame soft-story buildings;
- strengthens the ground floor at the garage door or any other large openings with a steel moment frame, or other strengthening or proprietary shear elements; and
- braces the perimeter walls of the lowest story.
